(1) Wage Rates

The wage ladder above applies to employees hired April 17, 2006 and after.

The wage rates of employees hired prior to April 17, 2006 will remain unchanged, unless and until:

- The wage rates of employees within the same job classification hired April 17, 2006 or after, equals or exceeds the wage rates of employees hired prior to April 17, 2006.
- Or there is a change in job classification, or a transfer to another Customer Service Center.

When one of these events occurs, pay rates may potentially change based on the wage chart and the employee's Company seniority.

(2) Wage Ladder

Newly hired employees shall be paid a new hire rate one dollar (\$1.00) below the Classification rate for their job classification for the first two (2) months of employment. After two (2) months, employees shall be paid eighty (\$0.80) cents-per-hour below their Classification rate. After six (6) months, employees shall be paid sixty (\$0.60) cents-per-hour below their Classification rate. After eighteen (18) months, employees shall be paid forty (\$0.40) cents-per-hour below their Classification rate. After twenty-four (24) months, employees shall be paid twenty (\$0.20) cents-per-hour below their Classification rate. After thirty-six months, employees shall be paid the Classification rate for their job classification.

(3) Lead Employees

Employees designated as "Lead" personnel shall be paid fifty (\$0.50) cents-per-hour above their hourly wage rate. It is mutually understood and agreed that usage of the lead designation shall be at the sole discretion of management and that "Leads" may or may not be utilized as business conditions dictate. The "lead" differential is only applied to the hours worked in the "lead" capacity and is NOT built into an employees base wage rate.
