



WORK AUTHORIZATION ALERT!

All too often, Disney workers who are in this country legally, and who fill out the forms and pay the fee to have their work authorization ("Employment Authorization Card") renewed on time, are terminated by Disney through no fault of their own because their work authorization application was not processed on time by the government. The Union is taking a number of actions to protect immigrant workers' rights:

CONTRACT RIGHTS: If an employee's work authorization expires, the Union Contract guarantees the worker 90 days to get his/her papers in order and to get his/her job back with all previously-earned benefits (Union Contract, Article 13, Section 8(c)). If you or a co-worker of yours is running into this problem, contact your Union Steward and Union Representative immediately.

RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY WORK AUTHORIZATION: To make an appointment to get an "interim" work authorization, to which you may be entitled if you have applied for but not yet been issued a renewal of your temporary work authorization document, contact the Orlando office of the Citizenship and Immigration Services office:
